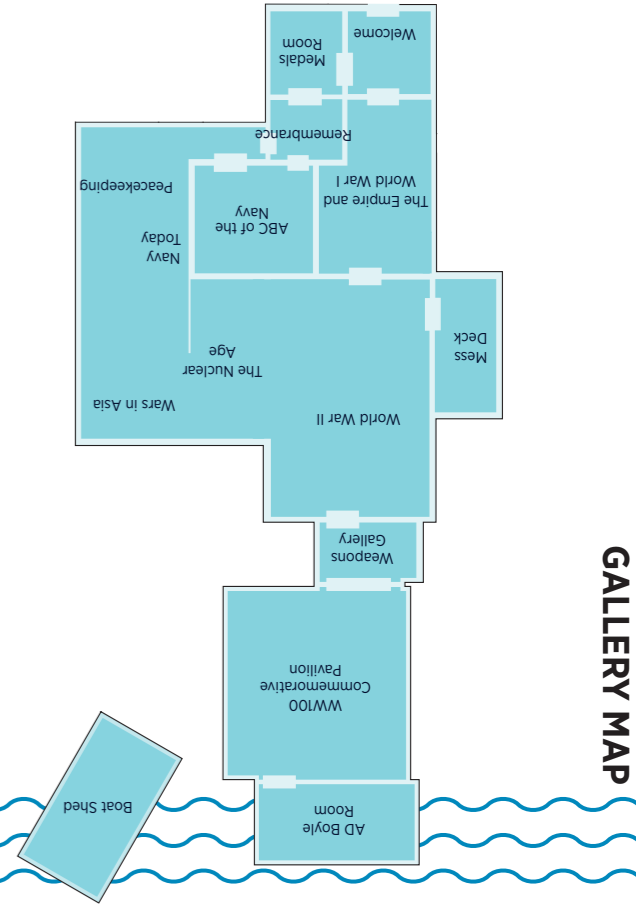

1 The Empire and World War One

Bells were used on ships to tell time, call to action stations and even to christen the babies of the men on ship.

Read about this bell and the ship it came from.

3 World War Two

4 World War Two

Turn the ships wheel. What are the Navy names for *left* and *right*?

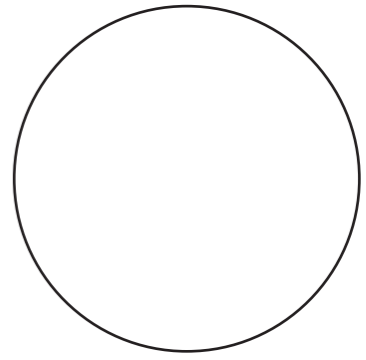
How would the sailor on the deck of HMNZS GAMBIA have felt sailing into Tokyo Bay, Japan, after the fighting of World War Two finished?

7 The Nuclear Age

Look at the displays on nuclear testing in Operation Grapple and at Mururoa. How is New Zealand's role different in the two operations?

At the time there was no medal issued for Mururoa, an unofficial medallion was made. In 2002 a new medal was made, The New Zealand Special Service Medal (Nuclear Testing). If you were to design this medal, what would it look like?



8 Wars In Asia

In total there were six Royal New Zealand Navy ships on active service in the Korean war. Find the names of all six.

Ces Cameron was a Navy medic who was sent to Vietnam during the Vietnam war. He helped servicemen and local civilians. The bead necklace was given to him by the Degar (Montagnard) people to say thank you. What is something special of yours that you would give to someone to say thank you?
