

Risk Management Plan

Children must be *supervised at all times* when visiting Torpedo Bay and the Navy Museum. A number of hazards have been identified to assist adult supervisors with planning.

Groups with children are to arrange adult supervisors according to the following minimum ratios:

ECE 1:3

Year 0-4 1:6

Year 5-6 1:7

Year 7-8 1:10

Year 9-13 1:30

Adult supervisors are to be **well briefed** by the lead supervisor, give **clear instructions**, and remain **in control at all times** - during self-guided activities, tours and school holiday activities. Every supervisor owns and shares the responsibility of child.

Please ensure each supervisor reads and has a copy of this plan

The boxes are made out of plywood. Although they have been coated with polyutherane and some painted there is still the potential for the boxes to have splinters in places which could cause minor injuries. The edges and corners of some boxes stick out which could pose a risk for bumping into.	Visitors should be careful when moving around the exhibit and students reminded to watch their hands. Adults must closely supervise their groups and remind them to move slowly and take care.	Adult Supervisor
The Bravery Boxes are 300mmx300mmx300mm boxes on a post with a door that visitors are invited to open. If used inappropriately there is the risk that fingers may get shut in the door or trapped in the hinges causing minor injury	Students must be actively supervised in this area and reminded of appropriate behaviour, doors are not to be slammed open and shut, and to watch their hands. There are IPads in the exhibition playing short films. These have headphones so visitors can listen to the narration. The headphones are attached to the iPads by a cord, which could cause injury if used inappropriately. There is a volume bar on the iPad, the volume level has been limited. Poetry Cube	Poetry cubes are not to be thrown or mishandled. Students must be actively supervised in this area and reminded of appropriate behaviour.	Adult Supervisor
Minor cuts, abrasions and general accidents.	Museum staff are First Aid qualified and there are first aid kits on site at the Front Desk, Classroom and Administration Block.	Adult Supervisor
Emergency evacuation of buildings.	Should it become necessary to the evacuate buildings, vacate the room by the nearest exit as instructed by the voice alarm or Museum staff. Meet at the flag pole. Await further instructions.	Adult Supervisor
